Wear pink to the meeting ---October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month- make sure you are up to date on mammograms and do monthly self-examinations.

What is Breast Cancer Awareness Month? Breast Cancer Awareness Month is an international health campaign that's held every October. The month aims to promote screening and prevention of the disease, which affects 2.3 million women worldwide. Known best for its pink theme color, the month features a number of campaigns and programs — conducted by groups ranging from breast cancer advocacy organizations to local community organizations to major retailers — aimed at: supporting people diagnosed with breast cancer, including those with metastatic breast cancer educating people about breast cancer risk factors encouraging women to go for regular breast cancer screening starting at age 40 or earlier, depending on personal breast cancer risk fundraising for breast cancer research Within the month of October, there are also specific dates designed to raise awareness of specific groups within the breast cancer community. Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day (October 13) October 13 is nationally recognized in the U.S. as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day. About 168,000 women in the U.S. are estimated to have metastatic breast cancer (cancer that spreads beyond the breast to other parts of the body). Researchers estimate that about 30% of early-stage breast cancers eventually metastasize.

The ninth annual Paint Gwinnett Pink 5K Walk/Run for Breast Cancer and Survivor Celebration is in honor of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Money raised from this event will benefit local cancer survivors and Northside Hospital Gwinnett Breast Centers. Let Shelia know if you are interested in doing the walk.


